

EDUCATION

EARLY CHILDHOOD SUPPORT

UWWCM, in partnership with Merit Health River Region, provides a free book and parenting resource manual to the families of approximately 600 newborns each year.

LITERACY

We partner with and coordinate variety of programs that support literacy:

- We provide every third grade student in Warren County with four free books each year.
- We distribute over 3,000 books to children at various events throughout the community annually.
- We facilitated the Post-COVID
 Educational Enhancement

 Program, a literacy intervention program that helped students gain an average of 2 years and 7 months of reading skills over the 2021-2022 school year.

HEALTH

COMMUNITY-WIDE BABY SHOWER

In 2019, 52 parents attended the Community Wide Baby Shower, with 98% enrolling in a parenting class and/or connecting with an OBGYN or pediatrician for the first time.

DIAPER DRIVE

We distribute more than 25,000 diapers and other baby supplies to local parents in need.

FOOD INSECURITY

UWWCM and our partners assisted and distributed the following:

- 28,300 hot meals to families and elderly and disabled individuals
- 264,000 pounds of sweet potatoes
- 14,060 pounds of chicken tenders
- 1,700 USDA fresh food boxes containing enough to feed a family of 4 for a week.



FINANCIAL STABILITY

AFFORDABLE CHILDCARE

Through funding, UWWCM is able to assist in the costs of after-school childcare to support working parents.

JOB SKILL TRAINING

By providing resources to our partners and providing intern opportunities, United Way supports training for individuals to become more marketable and better equipped for the job market.

EMERGENCY FOOD AND SHELTER PROGRAM

Through the Emergency Food and Shelter program, UWWCM provided \$81,328 in emergency utility and housing assistance to individuals throughout our community.

SUPPORT SERVICES

DISASTER RELIEF

UWWCM partnered with Warren County Long Term Recovery and UMCOR to raise and disperse over \$455,395 in disaster relief funds.

COVID-19

In response to the pandemic, we provided relief to our community by raising and dispersing \$148,229 in COVID Relief Funds.

Additionally, we distributed the following PPEs throughout our service area to local non-profits, churches, schools, early education centers and businesses:

- Thousands of masks
- Hundreds of disinfectant sprays
- Hundreds of thermometers
- More than 100 pallets of hand sanitizer
